So I offer our Holy Week and Easter services to you with humility this year, with a prayer that they may indeed help us to worship our Saviour who meets with at the table and cross as well as at the empty tomb.

Slow down, hear the story anew and wonder at his love for you and me. This is the gift we need this Holy Week and Easter.
