Updates on Repair to the Plaster Ceiling

Following a congregational vote on May 23, we were able to secure a loan from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan program to compete the necessary repair work. Having obtained bids from two companies in the area who specialize in plaster ceiling repair, Session voted to contract with Tiedemann, Inc. for this project.

Work commenced on June 1 and is expected to take 8 weeks, which includes time allotted to repaint the sanctuary walls and ceilings. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to Rev. Henry, Elder Gwili Marsh or any other member of Session.



Capital Campaign Consultant

As you know from the video we shared last month, <u>Update on Ceiling Repair and More</u>, an Ad Hoc Task Force was commissioned by Session in early 2020 to assess needs for updates, maintenance and repair. In addition to the repair to the sanctuary ceiling a number of other needs were also identified.

We have secured a loan from PILP for the ceiling repair and in order repay this debt and fund additional needs we are pursuing grant funding, discussing how best to use our existing funds and also investigating the possibility of a capital campaign which would allow church members and friends the opportunity to invest in the renewal of our beloved church building. We recently interviewed three consulting agencies which specialize in assisting churches with

fundraising needs and at the May meeting of Session, we voted to contract with the Horizons Stewardship Group to explore the feasibility of a church wide capital campaign at this time in our life. We are excited about the possibilities that lie ahead and will keep you updated as the process moves forward.

Help Wanted!

Looking for a person or small team to lead an effort to help our community members who are living in hotels.

We have a volunteer opportunity for an individual, family, or small group to help our community members living in hotels. For all those newly housed in hotels for any reason, we would like to provide them with a small starter kit of supplies to make them more comfortable. Supplies include things like: plates, bowls, utensils, can opener, and paper towels. In partnership with the Flemington Area Food Pantry we've come up with an established list of items that should be placed in a reusable bag. We estimate that we'll need about 3-4 bags on hand at all times and as of now, a bag is needed about once every two to three weeks. The bags can be delivered either to the individual at the hotel or to the Flemington Area Food Pantry.

More information on what should be included, how items can be delivered, and ideas for how to collect and organize the items is available if you're interested. We are also storing and distributing small dorm-sized refrigerators for our friends in hotels that are in need of them.
