Presbytery Transition

In January 2020, a transition working group commenced work to dissolve the seven New Jersey presbyteries (Elizabeth, Monmouth, New Brunswick, Newark, Newton, Palisades and West Jersey) and create four presbyteries identified by region (South, Central, Northwest and Northeast). The names of the new presbyteries would be self-determined. The purpose of this reorganization was to change the structure and function of presbytery by moving away from the model that centers on administrative organization towards a missional community that empowers congregations and ministries to "be the church" with fewer separate entities and greater collaboration.

In October 2020, the Elizabeth Presbytery (of which CPC was a member congregation) voted to accept the invitation to join the Northwest region presbytery. As of March 1, 2021, the Elizabeth Presbytery dissolved and CPC officially became a member of the Northwest region presbytery, which has chosen the name "The Presbytery of the Highlands of New Jersey". The Presbytery is located on Route 10 West in Randolph.

Children's Ministry Pre-K thru 5th Grade Sunday School

We are wrapping up one of our most unique Sunday School years to date.

We are grateful for technology that enabled us to stay connected through this uncertain year. Thanks to email and Zoom, we provided Sunday School lessons each week. We learned about "The Fruit of the Spirit," shared Advent and the Christmas story, introduced multiple Bible stories using *Illustrated Ministry's* devotionals, and focused on prayer (how to pray and what to pray about). Our CPC children participated in online worship through the year and last fall presented our first ever virtual Children's Sunday.

Help Wanted!

Looking for a person or small team to lead an effort to help our community members who are living in hotels

We have a volunteer opportunity for an individual, family, or small group to help our community members living in hotels. For all those newly housed in hotels for any reason, we would like to provide them with a small starter kit of supplies to make them more comfortable. Supplies include things like: plates, bowls, utensils, can opener, and paper towels.

In partnership with the Flemington Area Food Pantry we've come up with an established list of items that should be placed in a reusable bag. We estimate that we'll need about 3-4 bags on hand at all times and as of now, a bag is needed about once every two - three weeks. The bags can be delivered either to the individual at the hotel or to the Flemington Area Food Pantry.

Thank you to all who donated and helped out at the April 26 blood drive for the American Red Cross. We had 34 individuals participate, 6 deferrals, 2 double red cell procedures (1 was a single), and we collected 29 productive units which will provide for 87 hospital patients.

We will be hosting another blood drive for the American Red Cross on Wednesday, June 2 from 11 am – 4 pm. To encourage donations during this critical timeframe, all donors from May 28 through June 13 will receive a Red Cross T-shirt.

Red Cross will routinely screen for Covid-19 antibodies. Red Cross donors can expect to receive the results of their antibody test within 7 to 10 days through the Red Cross Blood Donor App or on our donor portal at RedCrossBlood.org – Red Cross Covid-19 Antibody Testing.
