From the Pastor's Pen

Friends,

Now that we have initiated in-person worship in the sanctuary, you've had a glimpse of what our music ministry will look and sound like in the immediate future. 

Mission Ministry

Mission Disbursements

During our September meeting, the Mission team went through their disbursements for the year, with the focus of the funds serving local organizations. Of all the disbursements distributed, 79% went towards local organizations (Anderson House, Bible Club Ministries – Philly, Camp Johnsonburg, CASA, City Relief, Clinton Fire Department, Clinton Rescue Squad, Family Promise, Flemington Food Pantry, Friendship Center for New Beginnings, Good News Home for Women, Grow-A-Row, Market Street Mission, and Open Cupboard Food Pantry) and 21% went towards national / international organizations (All Hands, Red Cross, Salvation Army, and Samaritan's Purse).



Mini Fridge Ministry





Many of our neighbors in Hunterdon County are housed in motels, sometimes for weeks or months, or even longer. As you can imagine, that makes eating, cooking, and storing food a challenge. In partnership with the Flemington Area Food Pantry, our church stores mini fridges that we deliver to our friends in hotels and motels. The initial supply of fridges came from the Flemington Order of the Moose, who collected and

We've delivered six of these fridges since the program started in May of 2021, with several needed over the past few weeks due to Hunterdon County residents being displaced due to the flooding. You can't imagine how grateful these folks are to receive a small refrigerator. Courtney Morrissette has taken over management of this ministry and she is thrilled to do her part to help our neighbors in need - and the Mission Team is thrilled to have her help!

Mission Opportunity: City Relief

CPC continues to support City Relief (Relief Bus). This organization supports the homeless in the Newark area and New York City and are based out of Elizabeth, New Jersey. When the CPC team is on the relief bus, we help out by providing hygiene kits to the guests. We are getting low on some of those supplies and we are asking the congregation to help out by supplying the following items: individually wrapped soap, travel size toothpaste, travel size deodorant and travel size hand sanitizer.
