Dear Friends,

This morning at home, we opened the first window of our (Bluey!) Advent calendar. Whether it's Bluey, Lego or sweet treats, our boys are always tempted to peek behind the next door to see what it is coming. It's especially hard to wait for the "big" surprise that lies behind window number 24. (Spoiler alert – it usually something related to Santa!)

Advent Calendars filled with tiny treasures bring little moments of joy to the start of our day, but they also remind us to go slow, to take our time, to be patient. Advent, from the word *adventus* in Latin, which means "coming", is a time for us to wait. To wait not only for the coming of Christmas as we remember Jesus' first coming among us, but also to wait for his second coming, with the promise of redemption for all of creation.

In his Advent Devotional, *All I Really Want*, Quinn Caldwell writes, "Since the earliest days, believers and scoffers alike have been asking "Well why isn't be back yet?" ... The author of Second Peter has an answer for them: he's not back yet, dear humankind, not because he's slow or uninterested or not coming at all, but because he's giving you time to pull yourself together before he does. Time to practice seeing him in small ways so you'll recognize him when he arrives in big ones...It's your job to be patient, to pause, to look, to be prepared for little bursts of delight."

In the midst of the busyness of this season, may we have the eyes to see Jesus when he shows up and may we be filled with delight.

Devotionals for Adults


