

# **Music and Song at CPC**

### A Note from Ted Brancto, Director of Music Ministry

With the downward trend of the omicron virus, hope is trending upwards! And with the music ministry specifically, there is the hope of reconvening the chancel choir and praise team in the months ahead. Over the course of the pandemic we have lost a few choir members, so I encourage all of you shower-singers and lovers of singing to think about joining one or both of the choirs so that we can present a powerful, full-sounding choir to the congregation! I will give you periodic updates concerning the progress of our plans to bring back choral singing.

The Bell Choir will begin rehearsing in early March for a performance on Palm Sunday (April 10). Rehearsals will be on Wednesday evenings from 6 to 7 pm. Please contact me (ted4cpc@gmail.com) if you would like to join the Bell Choir.

Another musical activity that people can participate in with or without a mask is hand drumming. I have done some preliminary research into the idea of having a CPC Praise Drum Circle. The drum circle would be open to people of all ages and would require no previous musical training. Drum circles utilize a "call and response" format in which the ensemble leader plays a rhythmic pattern which is then played back by the ensemble. If you or any of your family members has an interest in such an activity, please let me know. Your response will help determine how many hand drums we would need to purchase initially.

Our livestream continues to improve with each passing week. We are striving to improve the production values of the livestream, working to get better sound and video quality, adding cameras to provide new views of the various aspects of our worship services. If you haven't already checked out our livestream, please do. If you have any constructive criticism or ideas on how we can improve our livestream presentation, please let me or Matt Hodulik know. Matt has successfully trained a handful of people to staff the AV desk but we're always looking for volunteers to learn the ins and outs of streaming our services. Help us partner with the Flemington Area Food Pantry to provide mini-fridges to those who are housed in motels and hotels.


