

## **Spring Cleaning Baskets Collection Update**

We asked and you delivered! Spring Cleaning Baskets are on their way to Anderson House to help clients as they begin a new life! And you were so generous that we have more than enough supplies to put together more baskets as needed! THANK YOU!

In May, we collected items that would help women who are graduating from the program at Anderson House, which will serve two different needs: one for women moving from "half-way house to three-quarter house" and women moving from either "half-way or three-quarter housing to independent living".

#### **About Anderson House**

Anderson House (part of the Turning Point organization) is a well-respected halfway house program serving women recovering from alcoholism and drug addiction and their co-occurring mental health disorders. Their mission is to provide quality treatment to women and help them develop the life skills and goal-building techniques they need to return to the community as responsible, sober, and productive individuals. # **Pedals for Progress Event Update**

Our Pedals for Progress event was a great success on Saturday, June 18. We collected 35 bikes, 7 sewing machines and an additional \$820 to support this wonderful organization!

Thanks to everyone who contributed and to Jens and Tristan for all their work!

Pedals for Progress (P4P) rescues bicycles that are destined for overburdened U.S. landfills and ships them to developing countries where they are sorely needed and highly valued. P4P bikes are put to work not only as basic transportation, but are used as a supplement to school and community programs. The bikes are adapted for use as trash haulers, produce trucks, taxis, and farm machinery. Soon after P4P was founded, they realized that sewing machines fit their mission as well: They provide a relatively simple way to improve economic circumstances and they often sit unused in the US. #### **CPC Audit**

We are happy to report that a recent external audit of our finances confirmed that everything is in order. # **Exterior Improvements: Repainting the Exterior of the Building**

You may have noticed that work is already underway painting the exterior of the church, a high priority project on our capital campaign list that we hope to complete during the summer months. The good news is that we should achieve this goal, the not-so-great news is that it turns out that this project will cost more than we first budgeted.

#### What happened?

In preparation for painting, we asked the contractor who session approved to do the work to take a look at the exterior and his assessment revealed some significant and serious issues with the existing woodwork, especially toward the front of the building and you may have noticed pink flags all over the building which represent areas with issues or damage. Since the rear of the building is in much better shape, the painters have already tackled that area. We suspected that there might be issues and we planned for that in our estimates; however, we simply did not anticipate the extent of the problems. None of this could have been known until the work began and equipment was available to do a full inspection.

# Financial Updates

### **Exterior Improvements: continued**

#### What now?

In order to shore up the remaining exterior of the building and protect it for years, if not decades, these flaws need to be repaired properly before the painting work can be completed. Given the investment we have just made in our sanctuary space, the last thing we want to see is water damage caused by exterior weaknesses. The estimated cost for these repairs is approximately \$142,000.

This figure includes costs for security fencing, scaffolding, dumpster, storage etc.

#### How will this be funded?

The good news is that given your deep generosity during the capital campaign, we are confident that we can fund this necessary work while also completing all of the other projects which were part of the campaign in due course. We are also counting to pursue grant funding opportunities to help offset the significant costs of building repair and renovation.

Many of you can probably relate to these sorts of "surprises" and "unplanned detours" as you have undertaken renovations in your own home. We appreciate your patience, your prayers and your continued generosity as the work funded by the campaign unfolds over the next months. For now, your leadership simply wants to remain transparent about all major updates regarding capital campaign work and make sure that you feel informed and updated.
