From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

On Confirmation Sunday, I introduced a new song to our congregation, which we then sang the following Sunday as we welcomed new members.

The chorus is:

"Draw the circle, draw the circle wide, Draw the circle, draw the circle wide. No-one stands alone we'll stand side by side. Draw the circle, draw the circle wide."

On Sunday, June 5, we will celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the gift of the Spirit descending on the church, the Good News being heard and proclaimed in different languages and the circle of God's love expanding beyond the community of the first disciples.

Over the last month our church family has also expanded as we have welcomed confirmands and new members, celebrated two baptisms and the arrival of a new baby. Our days have been filled with joy and celebration. It is important to celebrate these milestones as we return thanks to God for all of God's goodness. On those sorts of days, it is easy to stand with one another, rejoicing.

It's more difficult, of course, to come together in pain, to seek God's presence there. To sit with the grieving and the lonely. It's challenging to know how to live, pray and act together in the wake of national tragedies like those in Buffalo and Uvalde. When it comes to mass shootings, our nation seems to be trapped in a pointless circle of finger-pointing, political stammering, and virtue posting, soon followed by faltering resolve.

Yet if, as the Psalmist reminds us, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world and all who live in it," we as God's people must find a way to stand with and for those who are suffering and bear witness to the love of God. As I said in church on Sunday, let us be unconsoled this time around. There is an alternate option. I pray that we will find the courage to not only imagine it but to work each and every day for it.

As summer days dawn, let us be restless for God's Spirit to lead us into holy work and witness as we draw the circle of God's love and care wider and wider still.

Pedals for Progress and Sewing Peace Collection Event

On Saturday, June 18th CPC will host a used bicycle and sewing machine collection event from 9am-12pm. This is a great opportunity to help clean out your garage and or basement and put those unused bicycles and sewing machines to good use. Pedals for Progress (P4P) rescues bicycles that are destined for overburdened U.S. landfills and ships them to developing countries where they are sorely needed and highly valued. P4P bikes are put to work not only as basic transportation, but are used as a supplement to school and community programs. The bikes are adapted for use as trash haulers, produce trucks, taxis, and farm machinery. Soon after P4P was founded, they realized that sewing machines fit their mission as well: They provide a relatively simple way to improve economic circumstances and they often sit unused in the US. Since 1991 they have collected a total of 163,785 bikes and 5,523 sewing machines.





The 2022-2023 PW/Horizons Bible Study Celebrating Sabbath: Accepting God's Gift of Rest and Delight Stony Point Center June 16-18, 2022 Led by the Author, Rev. Dr. Carol Bechtel



In this Bible study—with passages from Genesis, Exodus, Deuteronomy, Isaiah, Matthew, Luke, and Acts—we'll consider Sabbath:

- as a celebration, not a day of dreary formality
- as God's intent for all of creation that includes busy women too
- as one day of the week, perhaps a Sunday
- as a time to surrender unhealthy striving and frantic busyness, and instead trust that God will provide
- as a reminder that life is precious and working too much is against God's plans for our precious lives
- as a day devoted to community and justice and not exclusively to selfcare.

Ultimately, Sabbath reminds us to honor God who honors us by giving us a day each week to reset our pace, our priorities, and our lives.

The Reverend Dr. Carol Bechtel is professor of Old Testament at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, MI. She grew up on a farm in Illinois, attended Hope College, Western Theological Seminary and Yale University. She has published a commentary on Esther, and many will remember her PW Bible Study *Above and Beyond: Hearing God's Call in Jonah and Ruth.* Carol lives in Holland, Michigan. She and her husband have four children and eight grandchildren. Her hobbies include singing, cooking and gardening, and playing the Celtic harp.



The full program begins at 4pm on THURSDAY and ends after lunch on SATURDAY. Registration and check-in will start on Thursday at 3:00 PM. Cost covers 6 meals, a single or double room in either Gilmor Sloane House or a Lodge (your choice), and a program fee of \$40, which includes a copy of the study.
