Fellowship Hour Details:

Interested in helping out with Fellowship Hour but not quite sure what to do? Here is a quick rundown of what it all entails. And don't worry, if you have any questions, anyone on the Fellowship and Member Care Team is here to help.

- 1.) Buy snacks (ex: bagels, muffins, chips, pretzels, cookies, baked good, etc.)
- 2.) Buy juice (usually 2 half gallon juices are enough)
- 3.) Set up at about 9:00am on the day of inside: put out two tables, tablecloths, snacks and make coffee, outside: set up one table in front, snacks and juice, water or lemonade
- 4.) The week before your assigned date you will receive a letter from a team member with all of the details
- 5.) All dates will have 2 people on so you would not be alone.
