


All Saints' Sunday: November 6

Service spotlight - HOMELESSNESS



This year we are focusing on learning more about social issues around us and how the church might be called to meet needs and serve others in the name of Jesus. Our first area of focus was on homeless.

CPC has been serving with City Relief (formerly known as The Relief Bus) for many years now. Established in 1989 and with a home base in Elizabeth, City Relief is committed to connecting those experiencing homelessness with available resources. Each week converted buses travel to neighborhoods struggling with poverty and homelessness and set up a kind of "block party" where people can get a hot meal, hygiene kits and socks, and a place to be known. The goal is to break through the loneliness that so many people experience while living on the street.



On Sunday September 25th we were honored to have Brett Hartford from City Relief join us in worship. He shared a powerful message with us about being sure that our heart does not become calloused and closed to the needs of those around us.



Mission Ministry

Mission Disbursements 2022

During our September meeting, the Mission team went through their disbursements for the year, with the focus of the funds serving local organizations.

Of all the disbursements distributed, 74% went towards local organizations (Anderson House, Bible Club Ministries – Philly, Camp Johnsonburg, CASA, City Relief, Clinton Fire Department, Clinton Rescue Squad, Family Promise, Flemington Food Pantry, Friendship Center for New Beginnings, Good News Home for Women, Grow-A-Row, Market Street Mission, Meals on Wheels, Open Cupboard Food Pantry, and Safe in Hunterdon) and 26% went towards national / international organizations (All Hands, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, Red Cross, Salvation Army, and Samaritan's Purse).





We will be collecting and delivering food to local families in need. We are hoping to help families with more of their everyday lives, not just their Thanksgiving meal. The collection will be **from October 16 through November 13**. The boxes will be delivered on **Saturday, November 19**.

Capital Campaign updates

On Sunday, September 25, our Capital Campaign co-chairs shared exciting updates with the congregation.

Total amount pledged = \$891,000 from 71 families/individuals Total received to date = \$418,556 (47%) Only 5 months into the campaign this is remarkable!

LET'S CELEBRATE!

Exterior painting began in June and is nearly complete. The painters will return as the exterior wood repair/replacement progresses to paint the new trim and foundation parging. Supply chain challenges delayed the exterior trim work commencement until July. Our contractor has not yet received the full amount ordered for the CPC job but is proceeding with the supply he has. Hopefully it will not impede the progress.

As the deteriorated bottom trim boards were removed for replacement, it became apparent the parging which is the cement coating on the original stone foundation was in very poor condition and coming off in large chunks due to long term water infiltration. It is being addressed. The goal is to complete the trim work, flashing and slates on the bell towers by Thanksgiving so the scaffoldings are down for the Christmas season and winter. The work is detailed and slow but we are confident it is being done in the manner required by this 1890's structure and will last the test of time.

The handicap ramp replacement is on next spring/summer's schedule. The fellowship hall roof will be replaced this fall or in the spring as the roofer becomes available. A temporary repair done gratis should hold us through the winter if need be.

This winter we will turn our attention to the details of the interior renovations, those being the bathrooms, 2nd floor classrooms and kitchen. We want to be ready when the funds are available. Anyone who wishes to be part of the planning and design decisions is welcome. Contact Gwili Marsh if your creative juices incline you to help.
