As a congregation we will retell the story of Christ's birth with the angels, the shepherds and the sheep. (For this service, we ask that all worshippers please wear a mask.)


11pm Candlelight Communion Service

A Note from Ted Brancto, Director of Music Ministry

I hope that everyone had a happy Thanksgiving! We celebrated the first Sunday of Advent on November 28th, lighting the first Advent candle signifying "hope". The musical selections reflected this theme and we welcomed a familiar but somewhat rare voice to the microphone, Kim Bieksha, who has been pursuing a degree in Environmental Engineering at the University of Delaware. She was joined by Carol Kotopoulis on a rousing rendition of "Soon & Very Soon".

On the second Sunday of Advent, December 5th, we will unveil the 2021 CPC Bell Choir. I was gratified when 15 volunteer bell ringers showed up to our first rehearsal in October! Unfortunately one of our members, George Milligan, has been hospitalized with complications from kidney surgery (he was most recently admitted to a rehab facility). I have been learning about how to lead a Bell Choir right along with my volunteers! We have been preparing two pieces. One, "Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence", will be performed "live" on Dec. 5th. The other piece, which is a medley of Christmas carols, will be recorded in the sanctuary and broadcast on our livestream and presented in the sanctuary on Christmas Eve. Thank you to Kristen Madriz for bringing her two daughters to bell choir practice each week! Thanks also to a couple of new faces at CPC, Abby Doughtery and her son Adam. Bell Choir is a great way for people of all ages to be safely gathered together to make music.

On the third Sunday of Advent, December 12th, we will be blessed by a brass quintet led by one of our members, Lawrence Kursar. I am looking forward to the uplifting and spirit-filled music this quintet brings to CPC every holiday season!

Even with Covid protocols in place, I hope that you have enjoyed our musical offerings and find that they add to your worship experience. I'm excited about adding Dr. Zan Struebing on bass guitar to our ensemble whenever I can. She, along with Betty Ann Dhein on percussion (and Abby Doughtery on shaker recently) provide strong instrumental support for the songs and hymns we sing. As always, I'd like to invite YOU to take part in our music-making activities! I strive to keep these activities fun and rewarding. Please don't be shy!

In time, we will transition back to our familiar Chancel Choir and Praise Team - hopefully sooner than later. But in the meantime, I will strive to present music that will lift your spirits during these difficult times.
