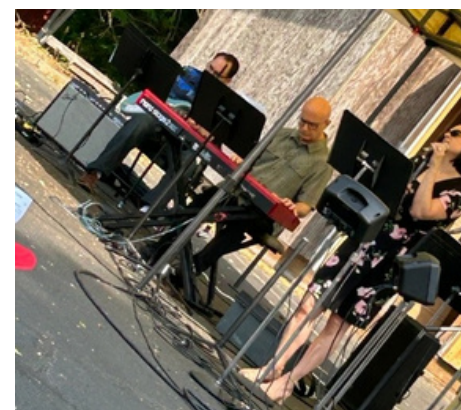

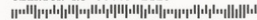

# Capital Campaign Updates - Summer 2023



As we shared in worship recently, giving and momentum around supporting the work of our capital campaign has continued strong through the first year. We have 71 pledges and the pledged giving total stands at \$903,404. Gifts from members, friends, new members and even longtime members who now live elsewhere have all combined to make this total possible. As of the end of April, over 70% of the total, has already been received. This is a three-year campaign and to be at this stage already is really a gift.



## EXTERIOR IMPROVEMENTS

Painting the exterior of the church was a high priority project on our capital campaign list and this work commenced in June 2022. That work was initially budgeted to cost \$100,000 however, serious and significant issues with the existing woodwork meant that this project became much larger than anticipated, and more expensive. The work on the upper level, which requires scaffolding, is scheduled to be completed by the end of summer. Work on the ground level should be completed by early fall.



## INTERIOR IMPROVEMENTS

### Renovating the bathrooms and classrooms

As soon as Vacation Bible School ends, the work of renovating all three bathrooms will begin, with the goal of having three much more functional spaces by early fall. This means that we will be without usable bathrooms in the building for a period of time, beginning July 24. Porta potties will be available close to the Wolverton Building. While we realize this is not ideal, renovating all the bathrooms at the same time and installing basic porta potties for use when nature calls is the most cost-effective way to complete this work and invest your capital campaign dollars.

Also at this time, storage and new carpeting will be added to classroom spaces and the tile floor in the upper hallway will be replaced. We are working hard to ensure that church members and community groups who use the building on a regular basis will be minimally impacted by this work and we know for sure that in the end everyone will be better served by the refreshed spaces. Thank you in advance for your patience and flexibility.

Effective July 24, staff will mostly be working remotely with scheduled time in the office each week. Should you need to connect with any staff member in person, please contact them to schedule a time.
