

Dear Friends,

Earlier this week as I was reading the Easter story from each of the gospels in preparation for our Easter celebrations these words from Mary Oliver came to mind:

"Instructions for living a life: Pay attention. Be astonished. Tell about it."

I commend these instructions to you for the journey from Palm Sunday through Holy Week and Easter Sunday.

Pay attention. I know the stories are familiar ones, but when we are really paying attention we see and hear details we may have otherwise have overlooked. God is still speaking. Listen with the eyes of your heart as this love story unfolds anew in your life.

Be astonished. Yes, it's really true that Jesus knelt in humility and washed his disciples' feet. Yes, it's really true that he directs us to do the same. Yes, it's really true that the tomb could not contain Jesus. Yes, it's still true that despite all the evidence to the contrary death does not have the final say in our lives or in this world.

Tell about it. When Mary met the risen Jesus in the garden she wanted to stay there, to make sure he never escaped her sight again. Jesus instruction was this. "Do not hold on to me. But go, tell..." That instruction echoes down from all the way to this beautiful corner of the garden.

You and I already know how the story ends with joy on Easter morning. You don't have to wait until then to invite others to hear the Good News. Reach out to a friend. Offer a neighbor a ride to church on Easter morning. Our world is longing for some good news and we have the privilege of being witnesses.

"Pay attention. Be astonished. Tell about it."

May you know great hope and joy this Easter season.

#### Good Friday, March 30 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary


Gather in the darkened sanctuary for a service of worship and prayer.


